SPAN 5338. Second Language Teaching Methodology

Tuesday 6-8:50/ The University Center- The Woodlands

This course addresses second language acquisition theories and their relationship to effective approaches of teaching language skills (listening, speaking, reading and writing) to foreign language learners. Additional emphasis is given to the evaluation of proficiency competencies based on state and federal guidelines. Reading, writing assignments and discussions will be in Spanish.

SPAN 5373. Theories and Practices of Translation and Interpretation

This course will train students in the cognitive processes and language skills required to translate and interpret written or audiovisual texts. Discussions and assignments are in Spanish and in English.

SPAN 5334. Spanish American Short Story

Online Course

This course focuses on Spanish-American Short Story with in-depth study of the most significant authors, themes, styles, literary periods, historical frame and the geographical spaces in which the works were created. The professor will make a selection of the authors and short stories, with focus on both its artistic and social importance. Reading, writing assignments and discussions will be in Spanish. Students will write a research paper as the final project for this course.

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
