




SHSU offers a wide variety of programs, activities, and facilities to help you attain your goals. shsu.edu/recsports

BEGINNING FRESHMAN STUDENTS

SUBMIT:

- 1. Completed online application for admission with a nonrefundable \$45 application fee. applytexas.org Fall application deadline: August 1 Spring application deadline: December 1
- 2. Official ACT or SAT I scores required regardless of class rank.
- 3. Official high school transcript showing date of graduation and class rank.

REQUIREMENTS:

Eligible beginning freshman students must graduate from an accredited* high school, completing at least the recommended high school plan or meet the College Readiness Standards on the ACT or SAT.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

SUBMIT:

- 1. Completed online application for admission with a nonrefundable \$45 application fee. applytexas.org
- 2. Official transcripts on all previous coursework from ALL colleges or universities attended.

REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. *0-11 hours* must meet beginning freshman requirements and have a minimum 2.5 gpa on transferable hours.
- 12-17 hours must have a minimum 2.5 gpa on transferable hours. 18+ hours must have a minimum 2.0 gpa on transferable hours.
- 2. Eligible transfer students must not be on suspension from any other college or university. Coursework must be transferable college level semester hours.
- 3. Sam Houston State University accepts a maximum of 66 academic hours plus four hours of activity-based physical education (kinesiology) for a total of 70 semester credit hours from the accredited community colleges attended.
