





Why Do an internship?


Students earn 9 hours of academic credit while interning with such organizations as INTERPOL, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the U.S. Marshals Service, or the Department of Homeland Security, as well as local probation and parole agencies, police and sheriff's departments, child protective agencies, crime labs, and prosecutors' offices.

What are the Requirements?

- Must have completed 90+ semester hours toward degree requirements.
- Must have completed the 18-semester-hour Criminal Justice core curriculum.
- Must have a minimum overall G.P.A. of 2.0.
- Must meet respective agency requirements.

Final Exams are just around the corner...Are you prepared?

Time management. Before finals begin, get out your calendar and map out a specific study schedule. Then stick with the schedule.

Schedule in study breaks. Don't plan to study non-stop for the next five days. You'll go insane, and you'll be too fried to do well on the exams. When you write your schedule, include short study breaks to help you recharge.

Schedule in sleep. Some people can function well on three hours of sleep a night. Most cannot. You'll do much better during exams if your mental state is good, and sleep is essential for this.

Prioritize. You have limited time to study and will have to choose what to spend the most time with.

Ask your professor for help. If you're confused about your notes or the readings, go to the resident expert. This works much better if you don't put off studying until the last minute. It's a good idea to read through all of your notes before you start to study, so that you can inquire early about things that confuse you.

Keep things in perspective. What's the worst thing that can happen if you don't do well on this test? Excessive stress will make you crazy and hurt your performance on tests, so as much as you can, relax. And if you're having serious problems with anxiety during final exams, seek help at your school's counseling center. This is a common problem that schools are well equipped to help you with.
