## Texas State Employees' Workers' Compensation - Notice To New Employees

The State of Texas provides workers' compensation insurance to protect you in the event of a workrelated injury or illness through the State Office of Risk Management. Although the Texas Workers' Compensation Rules allow employees up to 30 days to notify an employer of an injury/illness, it is the policy of Sam Houston State University that the employee notifies their supervisors immediately when an injury/illness occurs. Additionally, employees and supervisors are responsible for timely completion of required claim forms.

Workers' compensation is the exclusive remedy for an on-the-job injury. This means that the employee may not sue the employer or co-workers for damages. However, an employee may notify their employer in writing within five days of beginning work that they do <u>not</u> want to be covered by workers' compensation and prefer to keep the common-law right to recover damages for personal injury or death. If you elect to retain your common-law right of action, you cannot obtain workers' compensation income or medical benefits. Additionally, the state provided Texas Employees Group Benefits Program does <u>not</u> cover expenses for occupational illness or injuries sustained at work, regardless of whether they are covered by workers' compensation or similar state or federal programs.

## Workers Compensation Network - Acknowledgement

I have received information that tells me how to get health care under workers' compensation insurance. If I am hurt on the job and live in the service area described in this information, I understand that:

- 1. I must choose a treating doctor from the list of doctors in the network.
- 2. I may ask my HMO primary care physician to agree to serve as my treating doctor.
- 3. I must go to my treating doctor for all health care for my injury. If I need a specialist, my treating doctor will refer me. If I need emergency care, I may go anywhere.
- 4. The insurance carrier will pay the treating doctor and other network providers.
- 5. I might have to pay the bill if I get health care from someone other than a network doctor without network approval.
