As of Fall 2010, each student in the program, pre-internship, will receive an annual stipend of \$16,000 from one of the above funding sources, plus additional summer funding of up to \$3,000. Each student also receives a waiver of out-of-state tuition, but is required to pay in-state tuition. Students can also receive loans for which they are eligible.
