



French Keyboard Shortcuts for International Characters

When you are writing a paper in French you can format your text with keyboard shortcuts or numerical commands as follows:

(refer to your textbook or professor for clarification on the use of accents on capital letters)

If the keyboard shortcut has a “+” you need to hold the keys down at the same time.

If the keyboard shortcut has a “,” between keys, then you just enter the keys in that sequence.

To create some characters, you must press two or three keys simultaneously, followed by another key.

To type a lower case character when the SHIFT key is part of the keys used, hold down the CTRL+SHIFT+symbol keys simultaneously, and then release them before typing the letter.
