# Tourism Carrying Capacities





Tourism is defined as the activities of visitors outside of their usual environment for less than a year for any purpose (business, leisure, or other personal purpose) other than to be employed in the country/place visited.

**Tourism carrying** capacity refers to the number of tourists a destination or attraction can support and sustain.







Physical carrying capacity refers to the limits of a particular space.






Perceptual carrying capacity refers to the extent of tourism that can occur without tourist dissatisfaction.

Social carrying capacity refers to the extent of tourism that can occur without local community dissatisfaction.







### Terms:

**tourism carrying capacity**. Refers to the number of tourists a destination or attraction can support and sustain

**physical carrying capacity**. The limits of a particular space, such as the number of tourists a site can contain

**environmental carrying capacity**. The extent of tourism that can take place at a site before its environment experiences negative effects

**perceptual carrying capacity**. The extent of tourism that can take place at a site before tourist dissatisfaction occurs

**social carrying capacity**. The extent of tourism that can take place at a site before the local community becomes dissatisfied
