

### MINOR IN LATIN AMERICAN AND LATINX STUDIES

Students in this 18-semester credit-hour minor are immersed in the language and cultural history of the Latin American region, which includes the transnational migration of peoples, ideas, and goods across the Spanish-speaking world. The minor provides valuable training for those pursuing careers in business, criminal justice and law, education, health, public administration, the publishing and media industries, and social work. These expanding career fields seek students with a solid and critical interpretation of the transnational experiences and the contributions of Latin Americans and Latinxs in the United States and abroad. The minor equips students with career skills and prepare them for potential graduate study in multiple fields.

Each student pursuing a minor in LALS will complete 18 semester credit hours of required and elective courses from a wide array of courses as designated below. LALS courses will be taught in English. SPAN courses may be conducted in English or Spanish.

### **NEWLY DEVELOPED COURSES**

LALS 2311 Introduction to Latin American and Latinx Studies / Intro LatAm&Latinx Studies Students apply core interdisciplinary concepts to examine a complex and diverse range of themes and perspectives. Topics may include language, culture, history, civil rights, and social and political identities in Latin America, Spain, and the United States. (**REQUIRED**)

LALS 2321 Latin American and Latinx Literature and Culture / LatAm & Latinx Lit & Culture Students analyze selected literary genres and cultural themes across the national boundaries of Latin America, Spain, and the United States. Topics include migration, exile, and native literatures. Students access the Hispanic world through texts written in or translated to English. (REQUIRED)

LALS 2331 Latin American and Latinx Linguistics and Culture / LatAm & Latinx Ling & Culture Students integrate interdisciplinary research methodologies in applied linguistics through a cultural lens to investigate linguistic phenomena in contemporary Latin America, Spain, and the United States. Topics include language use in specific cultural contexts such as civil rights and politics, language variation, and linguistic identity. (REQUIRED)

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# LALS 3340 Latin American and Latinx Gender Studies/ LatAm&Latinx Gender Studies

Students apply key interdisciplinary concepts to critique the meanings of sex and gender in Latin America, Spain, and the United States. Topics include contemporary and historical approaches to investigate issues of gender and sexuality, and the multiple ways that sex and gender interact with race, class, nationality and other social identities.

## LALS 3350 Latin American and Latinx Cross-Cultural Communication/ Cross-Cultural Communication

Students examine the complex relationship between language usage and cultural influences through a study of the linguistic, social, and contextual factors affecting communication in Spanish. Students also investigate the relationship between English and Spanish in contact. Topics may include conversational norms, pragmatic variation, and cross-cultural comparisons between varieties of Spanish and English.

#### SPAN 2350 Spanish for Heritage Speakers

Designed for students with a Spanish language and/or cultural background, the course builds on existing Spanish language skills to develop literacy through intensive formal and academic reading and writing which emphasizes the Latinx experience in the U.S. and throughout the Spanish-speaking world. Topics include spelling, verb tenses, registers, and transfers from English.
