Leadership Meeting – August 16th:

 Graduate Assistants, Drum Majors, Student Assistants, Visual Techs, Music Techs, Drumline Captains, and Colorguard Captains (guard and drumline as available) will meet on Saturday, 8/16/25, from 9 am to 4 pm. Lunch will be from noon-1:30pm on your own.

Early Move-Ins for Campus Housing:

- The standard early move-in date for BMB members is August 17th from noon-3pm.
- If you are not sure what is going on with your campus housing, please ask Prof. McBryde (dxm121@shsu.edu) EARLY IN THE WEEK. The later you wait, the harder it is to solve a problem!

Plan Meals and Snacks:

- We've got you covered with fajitas for dinner on 8/17.
- Dining halls open on 8/19 when the general student body moves into the dorms.

BMB Summer Band Schedule:

- Band camp ends on Friday evening, August 22nd.

Agenda for Band Camp:

• It is important that you attend every second of band camp practice. In just five days, the BMB will be able to perform the entire Pre-Game show, learn stand tunes, and have a plan mapped out for the 8/29 halftime show! While we will be spending

SOME time rehearsing fundamentals and working on our signature BMB sound, we will need to start learning shows right away this year!

Instruments:

- Members of the BMB march with the following instruments:
 - Flutes
 - Clarinets
 - Alto saxophones
 - Tenor saxophones
 - Trumpets
 - Mellophones
 - Trombones
 - Baritones
 - Sousaphones
 - Battery percussion instruments
 - Flags/Rifles (as decided by Tim LeBlanc)
- The BMB provides students with the following instruments:
 - Mellophones
 - Baritones
 - Sousaphones
 - Battery percussion instruments
 - A very limited number of tenor saxes to be decided upon during summer band
 - Flags
- Students wishing to march bass clarinet or bari sax must provide their own instrument.
- The BMB loans instruments at no cost to the members, provided the instruments are returned in satisfactory condition.
- Repair costs for broken or damaged instruments will be the responsibility of the student.
- If you wish to play an instrument that we do not offer, consider exploring rental options with your local music store or check-out Facebook Marketplace.

Supplies Needed:

Use this week to acquire your BMB supplies!

- Insulated water jug for practices
 - BMB DOES NOT PROVIDE WATER FOR OUTDOOR REHEARSALS
- Marching shoes You may use your black shoes from high school (they must be flat black, not shiny or patent).
- Khaki shorts no cargo pockets
- Short black socks for summer uniform
- Long black socks for formal uniform
- Black athletic shorts to wear under formal uniform
- Black belt to wear with khaki shorts for summer uniform
- Comfortable practice clothes and shoes
- Sunscreen
- Hats/sunglasses
- We do have some flip folders for students that prefer to use paper music. However, you must provide your own lyre if needed. Since we are using BEAM, and you will access stand tunes on your phone, you may choose to purchase a phone lyre holder for your instrument like this one. This is not a requirement, but you may find it helpful.

BMB Practice Schedule in the Fall Semester:

Take note of our class schedule. We require students to be available for all class times.

- Tuesday and Thursday from 4-5:45 pm at Upper Pritchett

Music Migration:

In the fall 2025, we will no longer post our music on the band website. We will be using the BEAM app instead. In the meantime, you can still access most of our stand tunes on the band website. Here are instructions:

Step 2: Select your assigned instrument part.

Step 3: Enter the PDF password.

All instrument folder passwords start with bmb and end with the instrument you play, with an added "s." Example: bmbsaxophones or bmbdrummajors.

There are no numbers OR capital letters!

The folders that are not instrument specific have the password "thembasses" Examples of these are the Fight Song and Bearkat Fanfare

Step 4: Select the Digital Flip folder option – or use the PDF.

2025 Games:

As you may know, Bowers, our stadium, is under construction and will not be ready for the 2025 season. Home games will be held at Shell Energy Stadium in Houston. The BMB typically performs at all home games. BMB Members are required to attend all performances.

- Friday, August 29th at 8:30pm
- Thursday, October 9th at 7pm (Homecoming)
- Wednesday, October 15th at 6pm
- Saturday, November 15th at Noon (Twirler Day and Armed Forces Recognition)
- Saturday, November 29th at Noon (Saturday after Thanksgiving inform your families! This is a required event!)

The BMB will provide students with charter bus transportation to and from games. When possible, and after our obligations are complete, we will allow students to ride home with parents or other family. We will discuss this in advance of the 8/29 game.

- The BMB will be sitting in sections 201 and 240.

Potential Post-Season Games:

- SHSU competes in Conference USA. The top two teams in Conference USA will play a championship football game on December 5, 2025, at the stadium of the No #1 ranking team. Please keep December 4-6th available.
- Conference USA is a Bowl Conference. In December 2024, SHSU competed against Georgia Southern at the New Orleans Bowl. Performing in a Bowl Game is a possibility for the 2025 season. Bowl season goes from the middle of December to the Middle of January.
- Though no one can yet predict opportunities that lie ahead, we can do our best to cheer the Bearkats on and be available if needed for post-season games.

2025 Exhibitions and More:

- BMB Picture Day, on campus on September 20th (7am to 11am at the latest, earlier if possible).
- UIL Area I Contest, Katy, Texas on October 25th (All Day)
- Friends, Family, and Faculty Show at Bowers Stadium on October 27th during our regular class time. This is the only opportunity for our Huntsville community to see our exhibition show (or any show, for that matter!).

First Year Students and Bearkat Kick Off Activities:

- Students in the leadership team along with pep-band members will perform as part of the convocation band.
