Should the future of America's foreign policy be one that embraces multilateralism, or should it take a more unilateral approach? Use historical examples or case studies from prior presidential administrations to make your argument about the present.
- 2. The COVID-19 global pandemic has illustrated that today's world is truly interconnected. With so many changes happening at once—climate change, domestic political unrest, the global economy, education, health care, trade, and tourism—we are seeing new ways local and national actions impact international issues. According to the United Nations, "the world is at a defining moment for collective action" to solve challenging global issues. Therefore, please discuss an issue of global significance, explain its impact on a specific context (local, national, regional, or global), what steps you would take to address it, and how you would inspire others, especially youth, to act on this important issue.
