#### A NOTE FROM THE DRAMATURG

"From flight attendants to murderers, to fathers and sons, Suzan-Lori Parks invites you to be a part of the worlds of these characters in her work, 365 Plays / 365 Days. Over the course of a year, Parks wrote at least one play every day and sometimes multiple, weaving characters and stories into a script often unified by theme. Using each passing day as inspiration, Suzan-Lori Parks invites the viewer to see through her eyes. Typically, theatre companies do as we have done and choose a collection of her plays to present together. While the entire set of plays is a testament to Parks' commitment to her craft, the individual performances are a testament to true collaboration between creative teams and the playwright.

Working on this play as a dramaturg was incredibly challenging and rewarding. Exploring our selection of plays, and the different realities each inhabit, requires extensive research. Unlike other works where you may have a set location or time, Parks manages to weave together humans from any time or place, creating a set of stories that allows us to take a deeper look into what it means to be a person; a part of a community."
