Examples of Direct and Indirect Measures of Student Learning

Direct assessment: Any method of collecting data that requires students to *demonstrate* a knowledge, skill, or behavior.

Indirect assessment: Any method of collecting data that requires *reflection* on student learning, skills, or behaviors, rather than a demonstration of it.
