Literary Game Theory and the Wheel of Fortune in Sir Gawain and The Green Knight, The Count of Monte Cristo, and Kimetsu No Yaiba

This thesis studies different literary texts representing different genres to explore how concepts of the goddess Fortuna influence the different tactics of these gamemasters: Morgan la Faye from *Sir Gawain and the Green Knight*, Edmond Dantes from *The Count of Monte Cristo*, and Muzan Kibutsuji from *Kibetsu no Yaiba* (Demon Slayer). Using this type of theoretical approach, I will show how each of these characters possesses a hidden, controlling power over their respective gamespaces, but whose unique personalities reveal different extents of a gamemaster's power over the game while in conflict with their players, who work to dismantle and control the game themselves.
