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**Sociodemographic Disparities With Satisfaction
and Autonomy at End of Life**

The End of life (EOL) is a sensitive and vulnerable time for most people and their families. In the US, disparities in access to EOL care and the quality that various sociodemographic groups receive exist. This work illuminates how quality of care varies for non-white people vs white people, those with different education levels, and income levels. Satisfaction with EOL care and autonomy in medical decision making are two understudied measures of quality of EOL care and how they differ for those in different sociodemographic groups will be explored in this work.
