Investigating Trait Profiles of Narcissism Using the PID-5

This study aims to examine the utility of the Alternative Model of Personality Disorders (AMPD), using its corresponding measure the Personality Inventory for DSM-5 (PID-5), in assessing various conceptualizations of narcissism by using latent class analysis to investigate what trait profiles of narcissism emerge.
