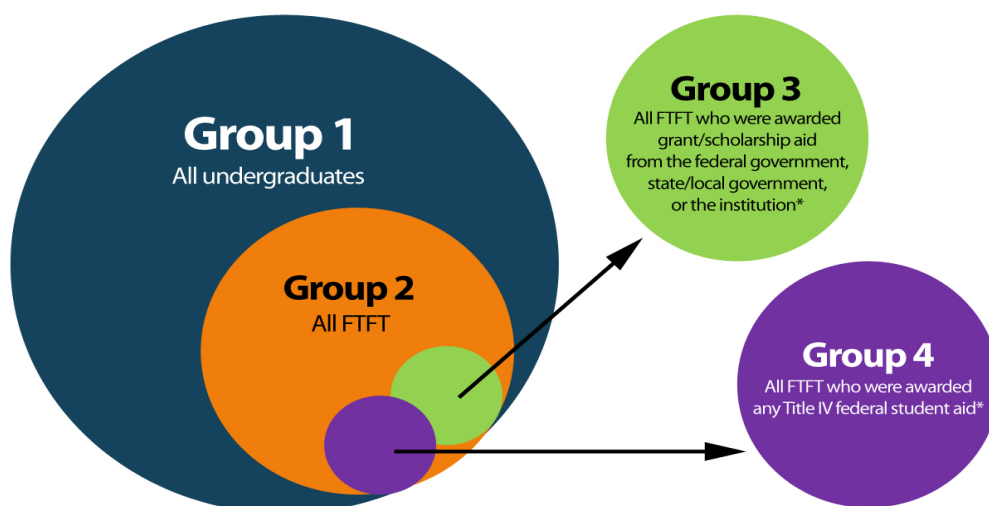
### Overview
