## Metaphors Faculty Use to Describe Assessment

Results from the Faculty Survey of Assessment Culture

Faculty were asked to "please provide any metaphors you have heard used to describe your institution's culture of assessment." A total of 619 out of 852 faculty offered open ended responses out of the 3,292 faculty invited from 39 institutions. Data were analyzed using classical content analysis methods. The following categories are offered as a means of representing faculty concepts of assessment culture. Please note that comments will not add up to 619 as most faculty offered multiple metaphors or a few metaphors could be categorized in two themes. A total of 1,149 discrete metaphors were offered. The average number of metaphors offered was 3.31 per participant.

<u>Vehement Metaphors</u> (A.K.A. Curse words) "Assessment on this campus is bullshit!" (*n*= 32) "You can't spell assessment without spelling asses." (*n*= 5) "Its the A-word on campus" (*n*= 31) "A clusterf\_\_\_\_" (*n*=9) Recognition of assessment as a "pile of deification" (*n*= 34)


