James A. Mobley, MD, MPH, FAAFP



Dr. James Mobley is president of Medical Arts Clinics, in Portland, Texas. He is also Health Authority for San Patricio County, Texas, and is Chair of the Regional Health Awareness Board for Corpus Christi, Nueces County, and San Patricio County.

He received his commission in the Army Medical Service Corps from Texas A&M in 1969. After Medical School he was transferred to the Army Medical Corps. He retired from the U.S. Army with the rank of Brigadier General after 38 years of service. He was Commanding General of the 807th Medical Command, U.S.

Army. He has received the Distinguished Service Medal, the Legion of Merit and the Meritorious Service Medal with 3 Oak Leaf Clusters. He has received the Order of Military Medical Merit from the Army Medical Regiment.

Dr. Mobley was born in Tulsa, Oklahoma and graduated from Texas A&M University with a BS in Zoology. He received his medical degree from the University of Texas Medical School at San Antonio in 1973 and earned a Master of Public Health from Texas A&M School of Rural Public Health in 2013. He is board certified in Family Medicine and is a Fellow of the American Academy of Family Practice. He has special training in Epidemiology, Nuclear Weapons Accidents, Biological Warfare Incidents and Occupational Health.
