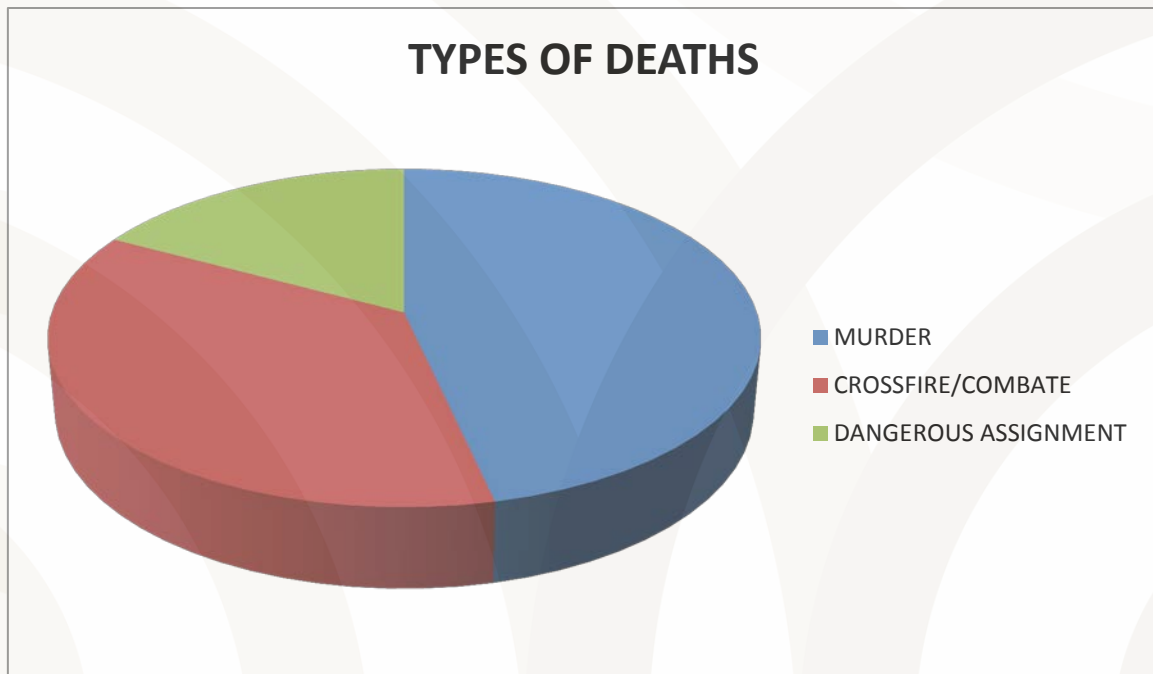

- In the past decade 975 journalists have been killed.
- Out of that 975 killed, 94% of them were men.
- 42% of the journalists killed were covering politics.
- 68% of journalists killed in the last 10 years were murdered, 13% were on dangerous assignments, and 19% were killed in crossfire/combat.
